COACHES COMMENTS:

Despite the large number of players who played in the team throughout the year, the 1st XV had a most successful season. The 1st XV reached the ACT A Grade finals, and defeated the Combined High Schools 1st XV, the Hawkesbury Agricultural College 1st XV, the University of NSW 1st XV, the other major matches for the season. There were a considerable number selected for representative sides which must be most satisfying for the team and for those players selected. Paddy Ryan was selected as reserve for the Wallaby Junior Match against the Springboks, and he and Andy Rankine played for the ACT. Geoff Bell, Morrie Meecham and Al McMurran gained selection for the Australian Universities Team at Jeff Johnson, Geoff Bell and Mike Smith played for the Interversity. ACT Colts XV against the Canadian Trejans. Den Muirhead was selected for this game but was unable to play because of injury. Tom Cobley was selected as reserve for the Australian Combined Services Vs ACT. My congratulations to those players. Prebably the most satisfying event which occurred over the season was the change in the players tactical

understanding of the game, such that fewer mistakes were made and the players at the end of the season were generally able to do the right thing at the right time. Consistency improved towards the end of the season, and I would hope the team is able to take this up at the beginning of next season. The most memorable features of the season were firstly the sound defence, secondly the strong team spirit which spontaneously grew as the season progressed, and thirdly some individually fine performances, which were, of course, only made possible by the team I make no predictions for next years results. I can only effort. hope that there are less injuries to players, and that the team can play consistent, intelligent and enjoyable rugby. Things to look forward to will be the 50th Anniversary of the HAC Vs RMC Matches, hopefully, a team tour. A final note, the last time RMC won the John 1 Dent Cup was in 1962.

COACH'S COMMENTS:

Despite the disappointment of losing the final, after gaining the minor premiership, I consider the season coaching the U19 A's as personally one of the most rewarding. My aim as coach was to introduce ideas, which could be improved on by discussion once the team had started to think about Rugby. Because of the willingness of most members to express a point of view, the result was that I learned as much as the team.

On reflecting, the most memorable game was the loss to Royals, when four of the team were away reserves with the lst XV. The dominating play of the tight forwards, the neutralising play of the loose forwards, and the persistent tackling by the backs all allowed us to maintain the lead until the last 15 minutes. This, I felt, was the most inspiring game and showed what the team was capable of. Congratulations to Bob SHEPPARD for his selection as Club Most Improved forward, and to Mick WHEATLEY on winning the Team Best and Fairest.

The season revealed the abundance of talented forwards. It would pay for some to consider changing positions to gain a place in higher grades in future. By the same token, backs need to specialize in one position, and improve or increase individual skills. However I feel that 1971 U19 As will capably fill positions in grade teams in the coming season.
